The fully-staffed Villa Sadia has been handcrafted and customized to suit a tropical holiday lifestyle, yet it seamlessly and sensitively combines its modern amenities and efficient service with a captivating insight into the traditions of rural Bali.

There is nothing ostentatious about Villa Sadia. Rather, the chic contemporary architecture is understated, ensuring that nothing detracts from the glorious rice terrace views. The fresh white walls and lime-washed teakwood fittings are broken by occasional splashes of red, turquoise and brown, juxtaposed against the greenery of the villa's immaculate lawns

The living room is cooled by ceiling fans and natural breezes, and bordered by sliding glass walls that invite the garden indoors. On one side is a fish pond with stepping stones and on the other is the terrace, which is a great spot of barbeques, expertly prepared by the staff. The dining area is simple; furnished with a table for eight, and a spotless kitchen is a dream in white, featuring polished marble work surfaces, a service bar and snow white cabinets well stocked with high quality tableware and glassware. Most importantly, it has all the modern cooking and food preparation appliances that the cook needs for the creation of delicious meals.

At the top of the staircase is another sitting room, sporting a bold red theme in the midst of all the white décor. This room offers a more private and cozy air-conditioned option for watching movies and TV. Here, red lanterns dangle from a vaulted roof above terrazzo floor, and sofas are positioned around a coffee table and a red shagpile rug.

The bedrooms are equally enticing, each with their own sunlit bathroom, all of which have the feeling of being in the open air due to their glass roofs and leafy plants. Two of the bedrooms are located upstairs, one is downstairs, while the fourth flaunts a turquoise plumage within a stand-alone pavilion on the opposite side of the pretty entrance courtyard.

Last but not least is the garden which is simply gorgeous. A pathway runs through a velvety lawns that gently slopes down to the swimming pool and tree-lined river with rice terraces rising steeply on the other side. The stone pool deck and furnishing follows the white theme of the villa, complementing the pool pavilion and bar, with a table for alfresco dining.
